It has been a bittersweet summer so far (Idiom: some happiness and sadness).



Course Descriptions

General English Beginner Class

This course focuses on Everyday English. We will work on communication and language we need for everyday life in Canada.

We will also cover basic grammar structures to help you with your speaking, writing, reading and listening.

General English Intermediate Class

This course focuses on everyday communication in English, with emphasis on speaking, listening, and reading. Weekly topics include a variety of learning activities that will focus on building vocabulary, grammar structure, and pronunciation practice. We will also focus on conversation practice and tips for better communication with other English speakers.

CELPIP Introductory Class

This course is an introduction to the CELPIP exam (The Canadian English Language Proficiency Index Program). We will focus on all 4 parts of the exam: Speaking, Listening, Reading, Writing. It is an overview of what you need to know to do well in the CELPIP exam. We will cover the basic grammar structures that you will need in order to complete all exam sections.

CELBAN Class

The CELBAN Preparation course is designed to help prepare students for the Canadian English Language Benchmark Assessment for **Nurses** (CELBAN) with a focus on the speaking and writing components of the exam.

This course is specifically for those who are required to demonstrate English language proficiency before applying and entering the nursing occupation in Canada, or those planning to apply for College of Licensed Practical Nurses of BC licensure, College of Registered Nurses of BC licensure, College of Registered Psychiatric Nurses of BC licensure.

ESL Hot Topics Mini class - 4-5 students (high intermediate)

This course is designed for students who are currently at an intermediate to advanced level of communication in English, but want to advance and expand their vocabulary, reading and writing skills to the next level.

In this course we will study with weekly current "hot topics" to grow and apply more formal and advanced vocabulary to your daily communication skills.


All classes require students to do some homework. Although it is voluntary, it is highly recommended!!
